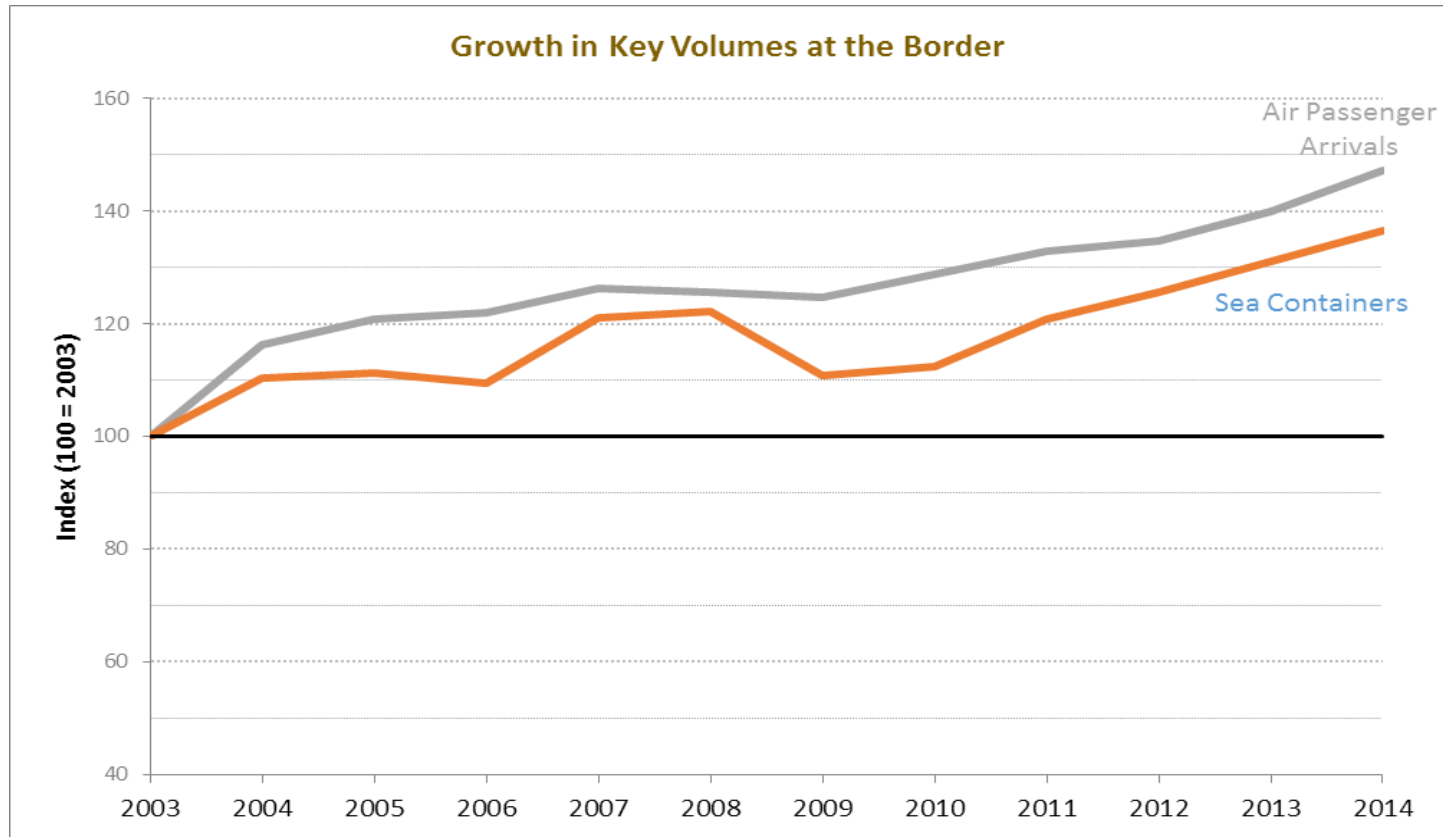

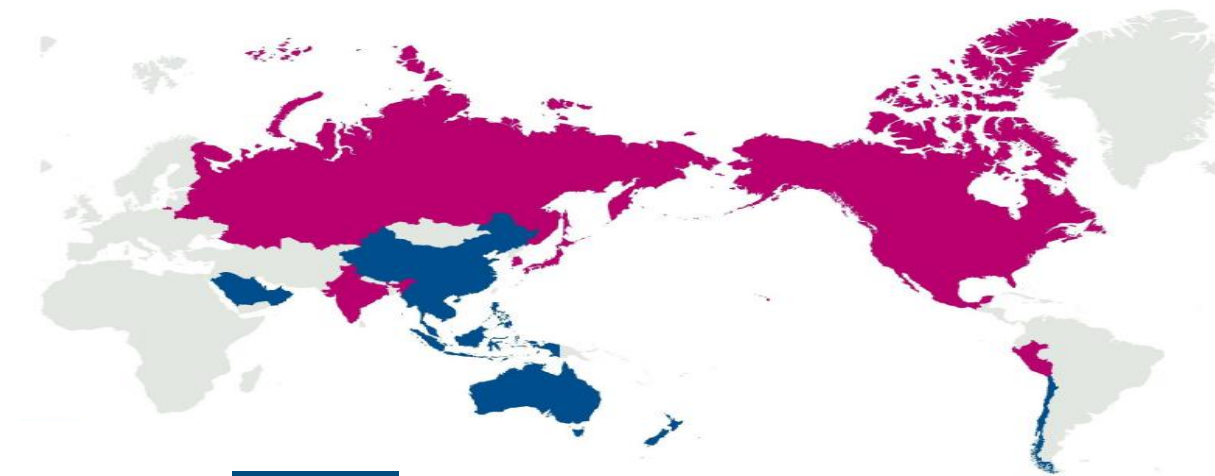
Key points

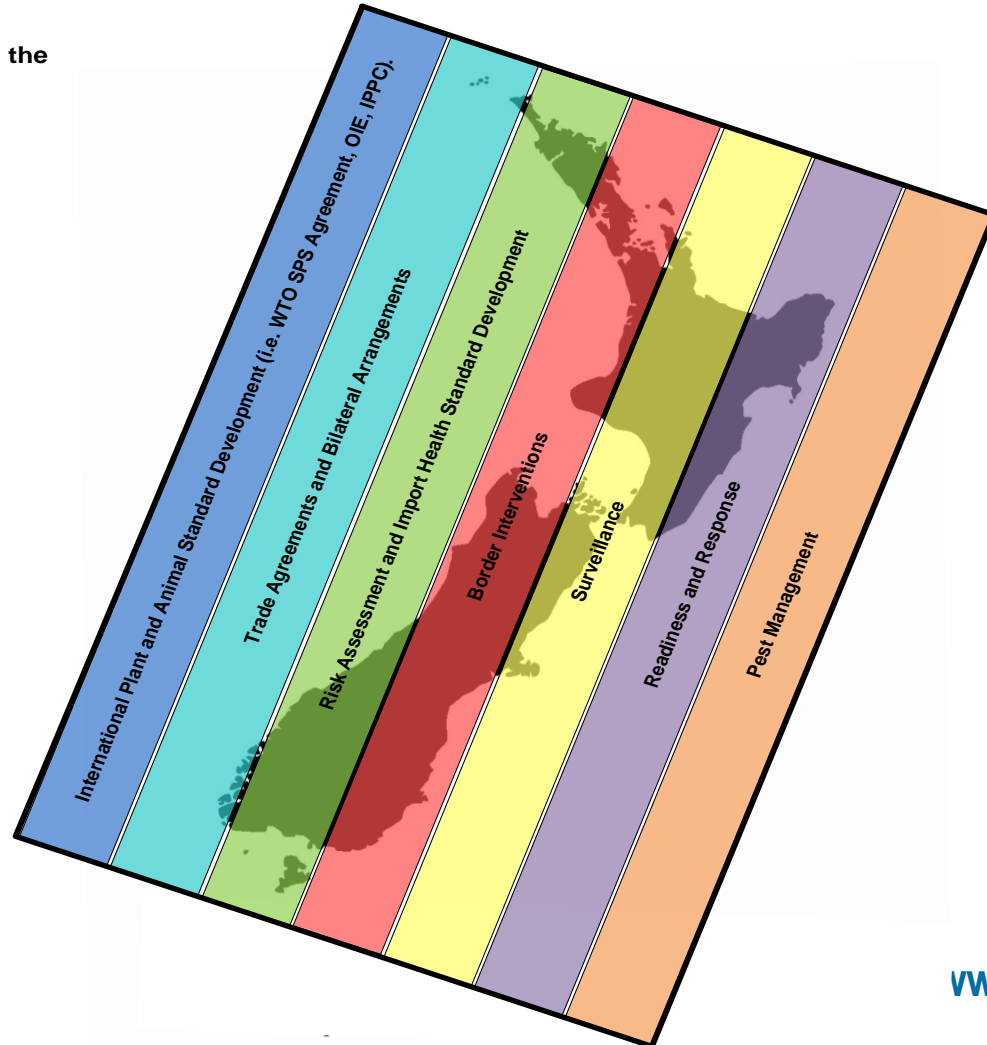

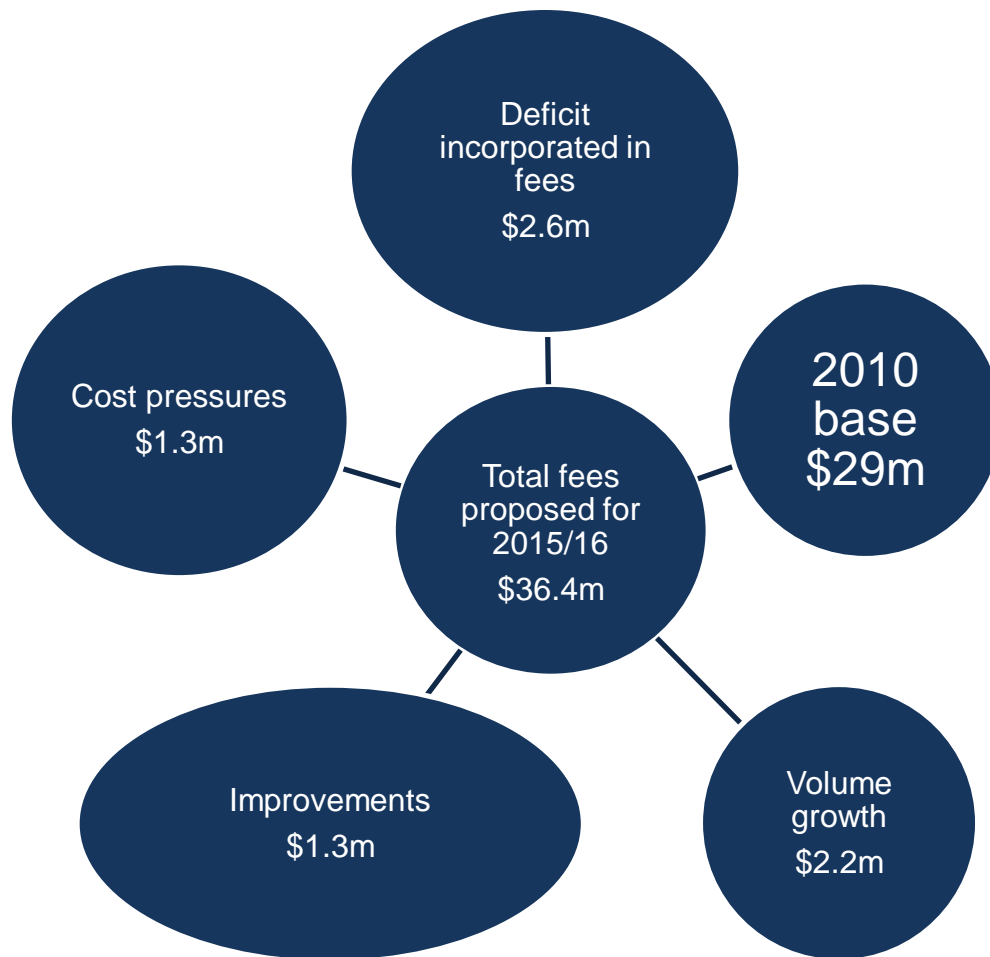

Biosecurity Cost Drivers since 2010

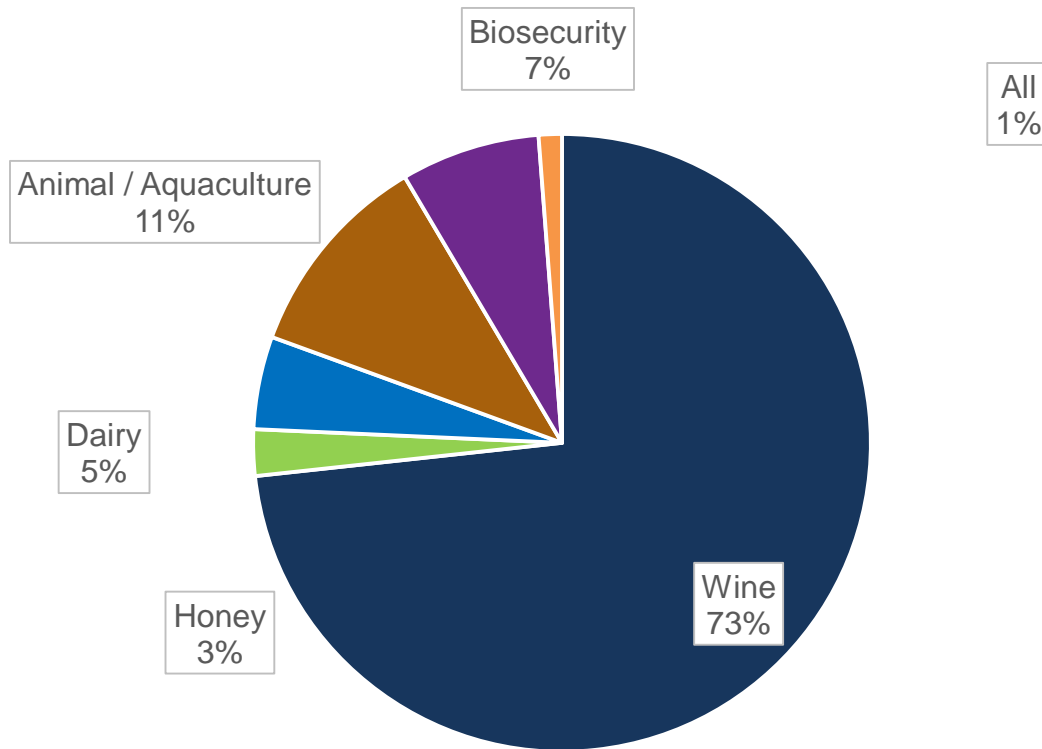

First Principles Review

- All MPI's cost recovered services
- Excludes new regulations for GIA
- Initial scoping work following feedback
- Consultation later this year
- Completion by end of 2015

First Principles Review

- Potential considerations:
 - harmonising cost recovery regimes across MPI
 - the overall cost of MPI fees to businesses and others
 - further analysis of practical trade-offs between volumes, prices and standards (including risk)
 - MPI's service delivery performance
 - timeframes for fee updates & historic debt recovery
 - appropriate funding source for all MPI services
 - alignment with other cost recovery regimes
